ADMISSION CRITERIA FOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDIES

English-taught Programme

Admission to full-time studies (with or without tuition fees) is based on a competitive examination within the number of seats allocated by the Ministry of Education.

For the English-taught study programme:

Criterion 1: The general admission average is the average grade obtained at the Baccalaureate exam or its equivalent, or the average of high school years for candidates from countries where the Baccalaureate exam is not taken.

Criterion 2: Candidates must submit, at the time of online registration, a motivation letter explaining their choice of the study programme. This letter must be dated and hand-signed by the candidate (Annex 2). It will be assessed on a pass/fail basis and is part of the admission evaluation. The letter must be written in English.

Criterion 3: Candidates must hold one of the nationally/internationally recognized English language proficiency certificates (as mentioned in the UOC Admission Regulations) or must pass the English language proficiency test organized by the Faculty of Letters at UOC. The minimum accepted level is B1. Candidates from countries where English is the official language or who have studied in English (proven through official documents) are exempted.

In the event of a tie for the last available spot, the following tie-breaking criteria will be applied, in order:

- 1. The average grade of the final high school year;
- 2. The average grade of the penultimate high school year.

Candidates with an overall admission average of at least 5.00 (five) will be declared admitted.
